What does this mean????

#### In class...

- Make room for learning. We balance forgiveness with speaking up to those we have a history of struggling with. Speak your mind, move on, in order to get work done.
- We are enthusiastic when leaders ask us to try new things



#### We are not...

- Rolling our eyes/sighing when we are assigned a new seat/group
- Complaining about new situations and working with new people
- Excluding certain members of a group because they are not in our friend group
- Responding rudely to someone who has a different opinion than we do



#### In Mass...

- We are open to the message that is being spoken in the Homily
- We share the sign of peace with all of those around us
- We do our best to sing/respond and support our classmates who do so



#### Outside of school...

- We stay away from situations that exclude others
- We are open to situations that include others
- We recognize that bringing others down is never the way to bring ourselves up
- We respect the opinions and dignity of others by treating others respectfully (in person and behind their back)



### How does "Neutrality" relate to real life?

- Success is impossible without being open to new things
  - "If you want something you've never had, you must be willing to do something you've never done." Thomas Jefferson
- As you enter high school, college, and the workforce, you will constantly be asked to work with new people on tasks you've never done before. In order to succeed, you need to be open to this!




